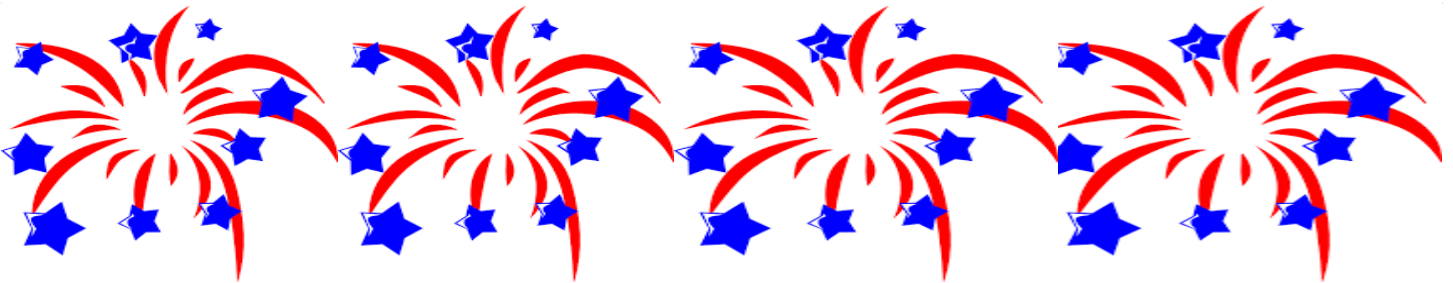

Indiana Veteran Benefits

Hello Members and Friends:

Tom Blandford and Doug Reynolds are the new Post Advisors. In every newsletter we will publish information regarding benefits for veterans, including benefits for spouse's. You may contact Tom at 317-902-1577 tom.blandford@yahoo.com or Doug 317-695-2071 duke9258@yahoo.com.

Hoosier Veterans and military service members may be qualified for state benefits. Disabled Veteran Property Tax Deduction is available for peacetime veterans who are 100% service connected disabled or over the age of 62 with 10% or greater service connected disabilities. Veterans who qualify for property tax deduction but do not own property may qualify for a \$70.00 credit on vehicle excise tax. Another source for the Military Family Relied Fund for activity duty troops is www.in.gov/dva. Before you donate to any organization check it out. Too many organizations only benefit the company officers. Be cautious.

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
